

bacteriophage [Virus](#) which infects and destroys a bacterial host. Some phages, however, will incorporate their DNA into that of their host, and remain dormant for an extended period. For this reason, they have become essential tools of genetic engineers.

Baltica -- n. A separate continental plate of the Early Paleozoic composed of the United Kingdom, Scandinavia, European Russia and Central Europe; named for the Baltic Sea.

Banded Iron Formation -- n. Rock consisting of alternating light and dark layers of iron-rich chert (the dark layers have more iron minerals) formed from 3.8 to 1.7 billion years ago.

barachois -- n. - A lagoon separated from the ocean by a sandbar, which was deposited in a delta after the last glaciation. The term is used in Atlantic Canada, where the landform is common.

barrier island -- n. A long, narrow island that runs parallel to the mainland and is separated from it by a lagoon.

basal group ? The earliest diverging group within a clade; for instance, to hypothesize that [sponges](#) are basal [animals](#) is to suggest that the lineage(s) leading to sponges diverged from the lineage that gave rise to all other animals.

basalt ? Highly [mafic igneous volcanic](#) rock, typically fine-grained and dark in color; rough volcanic equivalent of [gabbro](#).

basement rock -- n. The oldest rocks in a given area; a complex of metamorphic and igneous rocks that underlies the sedimentary deposits. Usually Precambrian or Paleozoic in age.

basin -- n. Any large depression in which sediments are deposited.

Basin and Range Province -- n. One of the most extensive systems of fault-bounded mountains separated by sediment-filled valleys, extending across Idaho, Oregon,



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Glossary

Explanations of a few technical terms in a variety of languages:

Talude (s) (Portuguese) The sloped soil “wall(s)” of patamares (see above).

Tonel (toneis) (Portuguese) Large wooden cask(s) which lie on their sides, usually over 1000 litres capacity. Graham's has some beautiful old toneis in the Sala do Baptismo at our Lodge in Vila Nova de Gaia.



Uva (s) (Portuguese) Grape (s)

Vila Nova de Gaia or Gaia ? (Portuguese) Porto is often referred to as Portugal's second city, but it's Gaia that really suffers from second city status in the shadow of Porto. Whilst commercial activity and the British trading community has always been based in Porto, the immense stone lodges where the Port wines are aged are all in Gaia.

Vindima (Portuguese) ? Harvest

Vinha (s) (Portuguese) Vineyard (s)

Vinha (s) ao alto (Portuguese) Vineyard (s) planted vertically on a smooth slope of up to 45°. Graham's Quinta da Vila Velha has some vinhas ao alto which are easily visible from the train line between Pinhão and Tua.

Vinhaço (Portuguese) ? The grape solids left after pressing the wine, which will go to a distiller for making into aguardente.

Dictionary Features

Napa now - Glossary of wine terms

Aperitif—A wine served before a meal.

Aroma—The smell of a wine, particularly from the natural characteristics of the grape itself.

Bouquet—The smells from older wines, primarily resulting from the winemaking process and from aging.

Sommelier (som-MAL-ee-ay)—The knowledgeable person at better restaurants who can give you advice and answer questions about wine. Often wears the traditional tastevin cup attached to a chain around his neck.

Ullage (UL-ij)—The space in a bottle between the wine and the cork. Also called "headspace". If there is too much, the bottle has obviously leaked.

Veraison (Vay-ray-ZON)—The stage in the growing process when grapes begin to acquire their color. Takes place in the summer.

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

extra dry

The only types of sparkling wine you're likely to see at the store are brut, extra dry, and demi-sec, of which brut is far and away the most popular. FYI, table wine that's slightly sweet is referred to as off-dry.

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


Chromosome



A chromosome is an organized package of DNA found in the nucleus of the cell. Different organisms have different numbers of chromosomes. Humans have 23 pairs of chromosomes--22 pairs of numbered chromosomes, called autosomes, and one pair of sex chromosomes, X and Y. Each parent contributes one chromosome to each pair so that offspring get half of their chromosomes from their mother and half from their father.

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

Pronunciation

A sex chromosome is a type of chromosome that participates in sex determination. Humans and most other mammals have two sex chromosomes, the X and the Y. Females have two X chromosomes in their cells, while males have both X and a Y chromosomes in their cells. Egg cells all contain an X chromosome, while sperm cells contain an X or Y chromosome. This arrangement means that it is the male that determines the sex of the offspring when fertilization occurs.


